



## **MORE STUDHAM**

### **FRIENDS OF STUDHAM COMMON**

The next work party is to be held on 18<sup>th</sup> September. We will meet outside the Red Lion by the war memorial at 10am. Work is planned to take place around Peter Enright's memorial orchard, where we will clear any excess growth, to keep the orchard in good condition.

We will also work on East and Middle Commons, where we will be clearing grass, bracken and brambles as necessary from the southern boundary, and mowing around benches and the main trees in order to produce a more natural appearance to the footpath. This work will reduce the nutrient levels preventing excessive growth of these plants, thereby creating a variety of habitats for small mammals and birds.

In addition, we will reduce the brambles around planted gorse at East Common car park and opposite on Middle Common. This is in order to prevent the gorse being smothered by the vigorous growth of bramble and other plants.

## CHURCH NEWS

### NORTH CHILTERN GROUP OF CHURCHES

### ECO-CHURCH

The news of floods and forest fires around the world in recent months is a stark reminder of the effects of climate change and the need for urgent action, confirmed in the most recent UN IPCC report. In November, Glasgow is hosting the UN Climate Conference, Cop26, in which governments from around the world will hopefully commit to targets to reduce carbon emissions. Over the next few months, everyone is urged to follow this news, get informed about the UK's position for reducing emissions (which seems like a promising start), talk to friends and family about the issues, try and find ways to support community, charity or company initiatives to reduce carbon emissions. Collective action is needed to make a difference.

### WHAT IS MICHAELMAS?

Michaelmas, or the Feast of St Michael and All Angels, is celebrated on the 29<sup>th</sup> of September every year. As it falls near the autumnal equinox, the day is associated with the shortening of days; in England, it is one of the “quarter days”.



There are traditionally four “quarter days” in a year (Lady Day (25<sup>th</sup> March), Midsummer (24<sup>th</sup> June), Michaelmas (29<sup>th</sup> September) and Christmas (25<sup>th</sup> December). They are spaced three months apart, on religious festivals. They were the dates on which servants were hired, rents were due or leases began. It was said that harvest had to be completed by Michaelmas, almost like the marking of the end of the productive season and the beginning of the new cycle of farming. This is how it came to be for Michaelmas to be the time for electing magistrates and also the beginning of legal and university terms. (September – Michaelmas, January – Hilary, May – Trinity).

**Michael**, in the Bible and in the Qur’ān (as Mīkāīl), is one of the archangels. He is repeatedly depicted as the “great captain,” the leader of the heavenly hosts, and the warrior helping the children of Israel. Early in the history of the Christian church he came to be regarded as the helper of the church’s armies against the heathen and against the attacks of the Devil. He holds the secret of the mighty “word” by the utterance of which God created heaven and earth and was “the angel who spoke [to Moses] at Mount Sinai” (Acts 7:38). Representations of Michael in art reflect his character as a warrior: he is shown with a sword, in combat with or triumph over a dragon, from the story in the Book of Revelation (Apocalypse).

## **MORE KENSWORTH**

There has been a general clean-up of the outside of the hall and the garden area has been trimmed and replanted. This means the hall is looking very clean and welcoming to hirers.

Obviously, we are hoping that we can continue to run the hall hirings to recoup some of the money we have lost during the pandemic and we hope that residents will support us. We are always looking for people to join the Committee, so please come along to the next meeting on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> September at 7.30pm.

## PARISH COUNCILS

### WHIPSNADE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

**Whipsnade Green:** have you ever stopped to wonder who manages 'The Green', or do you not give it any thought, or imagine it doesn't need any managing? Well, in answer to the last of these – yes it does – quite a bit of management is needed to keep it doing its job of quietly preserving the unique character of our village. In days past, animals would have been at work grazing the sward and providing a meagre livelihood for some local inhabitants. These rights persist to this day in the holding of 'stints' or grazing rights and are inherited through titles to property: One stint equals one 'cow common' enough grazing to keep one cow in milk over the summer season.

As a registered common, the land is also subject to a Scheme of Management and Byelaws which dictate what activities can and cannot be undertaken. Although a 'common', the land itself is privately owned by ZSL and is managed by cooperation and consent between them, Central Bedfordshire Council, the holders of stints and, most importantly, you, as residents, if you happen to live in Whipsnade, as it is also the Village Green. One of the most important tasks of the Parish Council is to actively represent these interests within the overall group of stakeholders, so that the beauty and recreational amenity of The Green may be enjoyed for all and for generations to come.

**Winter scrub maintenance on Whipsnade Green:** why not come along to one of the monthly winter scrub-bashing sessions which start this year on Sunday, 3<sup>rd</sup> October? Sessions are normally half a day - 10.30am to 2.30pm. You will feel fit and refreshed after a gentle work-out helping to keep encroaching scrub in check. Just come along on any of the days or call Ken France (872375) for further information.

The **next meeting** of the Parish Council will be held on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> September in Whipsnade Village Hall starting at 7.30 pm. All welcome – come along and have your say.

Please remember to park considerately and safely where it is allowed. Parking on verges is not an option as, not only does it ruin the verge, but reduces visibility for traffic at busy junctions.

Following its last RoSPA safety inspection, we believe the time has come to replace, rather than repair, the play equipment in the recreation ground.

Whilst we intend to look for sources of funding, projects of this size are very expensive. Thus, it is likely when looking at our budget for 2022/23 we will be making an increase to our precept, which means there will be an increase in the Council Tax charges.

As much as we would prefer not to have to increase charges, we must be realistic: at the end of the day better facilities will benefit many parish families. Increasing Council Tax is the main way that Parish Councils pay for community projects; once the budget is decided, we will let residents know.
