Dear friends and parishioners

One of the most precious and important parts of my role is to take funerals, and in our three parishes burials as well, in our own three beautiful and peaceful parish churchyards. It is quite unusual to have three churchyards which are still open for burial and interment of ashes. Many people find it surprising to know that they are kept looking so beautiful by a small group of very committed volunteers, to whom I am very grateful; unlike civic cemeteries, we don't have 'staff'! We would love more help with this work, which benefits the whole community, and if you could offer an hour a week or fortnight, I know it would be appreciated by more than just myself and the churchwardens.

Many people enjoy our churchyards – partly due to them being on public footpaths – and the Parochial Church Councils of each church are very pleased that they are so well-used; for contemplation, for exercise and for dog-walking. If you are interested in helping out, please drop me an e-mail or leave a message on my answerphone. As with any task this is getting to be more of an issue as those who have been doing so much for so long become less physically capable of doing it.

The past eighteen months or so have been a very difficult time for so many of us, especially those of us who have lost loved ones during the time of Covid, whether or not directly from the virus itself, and the chance to be able to care for those who have experienced so much loss through being able to offer services locally, has been very important. To be able to maintain this into the future is something that the churches in which we worship will continue to hold as important in the years to come. In the coming months, as we approach Christmas, there will be a service of carols and readings to remember those we have lost, 'Light out of Darkness', at St. Mary's Kensworth on Sunday December 12<sup>th</sup> at 2pm. All are, as always, welcome.

May God bless us with his love, this month and always.

## WHIPSNADE INCLUDING OLDHILL WOOD

**Prayers:** our prayers in November are for Remembrance, and for all who have lost a loved one in the past year. If you have any prayer needs, put them on a leaf on the prayer tree in the church, or make a request to the Rector or the churchwardens.

**Giving to Charity:** this is a vital part of our church's Christian life. During October we donated a collection in church to refugees from Afghanistan being cared for in Luton, a total of £120, for which the Luton churches have sent their thanks.

The Bishop's Annual Appeal received £185 from the Harvest Festival and £168 from the village lunch, a total of £353. Thanks to all generous donors. Thanks also to those who donated gifts of fresh produce and other goods that were displayed at the service and later distributed to friends, to Knoll House and to the Food Bank.

Every November the church charities committee selects seven charities, each of which receives a donation from its funds before Christmas. We try to spread our choice between local, national and global organisations, dealing with the needs of children, the sick and hungry and those in need of spiritual support. ### ECO-CHURCH

Food is a complex topic which we deal with every day; it can be hard to simplify into easy green steps to follow when family preferences, time and cost all come into the equation. We need to try though, as globally, food production is responsible for about a third of all greenhouse gas emissions which drive global warming. How many of the tips below do you already do? Could you try and do one more this month?

#### ***6 Tips to improve your food:***

1. Buy local to support local businesses and reduce food miles. Try to support your local butcher where you will have less food packaging, use fewer food miles and eat better quality meat.
2. Try to avoid waste. The average family wastes £60 a month on food waste and this contributes to increased greenhouse gas emissions.
3. Try having **a more 'plant-rich' diet overall:** finding ways to get more vegetables, fruit, pulses and whole grain foods into our diet can be good not only for our health but the health of the planet as well. You could try having a meat or dairy free day each week. Keep trying with your 5-a-day.
4. Try and buy food with less packaging. Make sure you recycle the plastic on the food you buy.
5. Make ethical choices if you can when you shop: buy Fairtrade items, free range chickens, organic meat and avoid buying products with palm oil in them. Try doing more baking at home.
6. Choose sustainably sourced fish. Look out for logos such as the blue Marine Stewardship Council (MSC) mark on products.

### ST ANDREW, PATRON SAINT OF SCOTLAND

Andrew was born in Bethsaida in Syria, but when he met Jesus, he was living in Capernaum in present day Israel. Like his brother Simon Peter, he was a fisherman. Andrew, along with Peter, James and John formed the inner circle of Jesus' twelve apostles. Andrew was a disciple of St. John the Baptist prior to becoming a follower of Christ.

So how did he come to be Scotland's Patron Saint?

Historical accounts show that he travelled widely, spreading the Gospel, though we don't know every place he visited. One legend claims that he actually came to Scotland and built a church in Fife, where St Andrews is now, and pilgrims came there from all over Britain. Another states that, after the death of Andrew, several of his relics were brought to Fife by St Regulus, of Greece, around the 4th century. Whichever is closer to the truth we shall probably never know; however, it is these links that explain why Andrew is now the Patron Saint of Scotland.


