Whilst so much has changed it is refreshing to see just how much has remained constant. The values of friendship, love and care for community and each other is still very evident. I look forward to continuing to get to know you over the coming twelve months.

REVEREND DAVE HEATHER



COME ON YOU HATTERS!



Recreation Ground Pathway: a final measure has taken place and, subject to sign-off, the pathway installation will be instructed to commence shortly. This new pathway will be positioned on the inside edge running along the hedge line of the recreation ground in Common Road.

FRIENDS OF STUDHAM COMMON

The next work party for the Friends will be on Saturday July 15th.

The work will entail checking the entire southern hedge boundaries of the commons and trampling any densely growing vegetation, such as bracken, to ensure it will not inhibit the growth of the hedge, leaving it thin and unsuitable for wildlife cover. This will also ensure a good habitat for future nesting birds.

On East Common we will trim the vegetation around the car park, leaving some cover for any lizards to shelter in, whilst providing a good clear view for any visitors. On both Middle and East Commons we will mow the main paths, depending on the amount of growth, in order to maintain a good access to the Commons for all.

DATES

SAINT JAMES the GREAT (Feast Day 25th July)

St James the Great, also known as James, son of Zebedee (died AD 44), was



one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus. According to the New Testament, he was the second of the apostles to die (after Judas Iscariot), and the first to be martyred. He was executed in Jerusalem and buried. He had visited Spain as a missionary, and when his remains were dug up, they were said to be covered in scallop shells, which is why they are his symbol. St James is the patron saint of Spain and legend says some Spanish converts brought his bones to Santiago de Compostela in Galicia,

in north-west Spain. Santiago means St James in Spanish and Portuguese, with its derivatives Diego/Diogo.

The traditional pilgrimage to his shrine has been the most popular pilgrimage for Western European Christians from the Middle Ages onwards, although its modern revival and popularity stem from Walter Starkie's 1957 book, *The Road to Santiago. The Pilgrims of St. James.* Officially, 439,000 pilgrims registered in 2022 as having completed the final 100km (62m) walk, or 200km (120m) by bicycle, to Santiago to qualify for a Compostela – a certificate and badge in the shape of a scallop.



The *Camino de Santiago*, in English, the **Way of St James**, is a network of pilgrims' ways leading to the shrine, in the cathedral of Santiago de Compostela. These days, people of all faiths - and none - make their various ways to the shrine, sleeping in little hostels and eating very basic foods, but all finding their 'inner selves' and making many friends along the way. Monasteries on the way give free wine to thirsty pilgrims! Some famous people's pilgrimages have been the subject of television programmes. For example, Rev'd Kate Bottley, Neil Morrissey, Heather Small, Debbie McGee, JJ Chalmers and Ed Byrne, to name but a few.

ALL IN THE MONTH OF AUGUST

51 years ago, on 1st August 1972, the Washington Post newspaper published the first article that exposed US President Richard Nixon's involvement in the Watergate scandal.

11 years ago, on 25th August 2012, Neil Armstrong, American astronaut (Apollo 11) died. He was the first person to walk on the Moon.
