On 8<sup>th</sup> May 1945, Prime Minister Winston Churchill broadcast the news that German armed forces had surrendered unconditionally in Europe to the Allied Expeditionary Force and the Soviet High Command. In the same speech, he uses the phrase "we may allow ourselves a brief period of rejoicing" (referencing the fact that the conflict against Japan still continued).

The black and white images of that 'brief period', poignant film and photographs of dancing and celebrating in Trafalgar Square and across the land, tempered with the knowledge of the loss so many had experienced in so many different ways, all go to build up what we will recall this May 8th, when we honour those who fought, and those who kept the home fires burning, the land and soil growing and producing the food so necessary, and who encouraged each other 'never to surrender' with an ordinary everyday bravery which needs commemorating with a time of thanksgiving.

We still pray for that peace so dearly won and so fragile, every week in our churches, and will continue to do so. May 8<sup>th</sup> allows us the space to do this together, and to commit ourselves to one another and to the service of the community – and to remember, with that rejoicing of which Churchill so movingly spoke, all who served, all who gave their lives, and all who lived through those years of war.

All are welcome to join us for a special VE80 service for the three villages, at St. Mary's Kensworth, Church End, LU6 3RA, at 6pm, followed by a toast as the bells ring nationally – just as they would have done 80 years ago.

"Together, we honour the past and celebrate a future built on unity, hope, love and peace."



#### WHIPSNADE TREE CATHEDRAL - VOLUNTEER'S DIARY

The NT rangers and the volunteers met to discuss the planting of the Christmas Chapel. At the end of last year, six Norway Spruce were taken down as they had become too large for their positions. It is now time to think of replacing them. There is now the threat of a national disease affecting Norway Spruce trees, so it has been decided to plant similar trees but a different species. The aim is to create a magical Christmas Chapel where children can play in and around the trees. We will then mow paths through the chapel and around some of the trees – most of the chapel is then left to long grass. On the left hand side of the car park, and through the gate on the right hand side, the NT have planted hundreds of new trees, which are all native to our countryside. These include Wild Cherry, Hornbeam, Field Maple, Hazel and Hawthorn. They are all protected by biodegradable guards. These are necessary to help them flourish without being nibbled!
