Dear friends and parishioners

As I write this, I keep being reminded of the harvest by the sounds of combines and tractors on the road outside. It's impossible not to be aware that they work to a very demanding schedule, and often continue late into the evening and night. I worked briefly as a farm labourer as a teenager, and remember clearly these long harvest hours, when everything can suddenly move very quickly, in response to the weather – and how that meant our working shifts would have to be flexible too.

We are blessed by those who grow the food we depend on. Often, we just consume without thinking about it, but without the farming families of these villages, and in other places here and abroad, things would be very different.

We owe those who provide for us a very real debt of gratitude. The Harvest thanksgivings and celebrations in our village churches enable us to mark this publicly – and will take place this year on:

- September 28 at 10.30am at St. Marv's Kensworth
- · October 5 at 9am at St. Mary Magdalene, Whipsnade, and
- October 5 10.30am at St. Mary's Studham.

Why not come and join us – and if you can't, then I offer you one of my favourite Harvest hymns, written a few years ago by Brian Wren, which begins with these two verses:

Praise God for the harvest of orchard and field, praise God for the people who gather their yield, the long hours of labour, the skills of a team, the patience of science, the power of machine.

Praise God for the harvest that comes from afar, from market and harbour, the sea and the shore: foods packed and transported, and gathered and grown by God-given neighbours, unseen and unknown.



ECO LIVING

As summer ends, many of us are looking at refreshing our wardrobes: ready for a return to work or school or simply to reflect the changing seasons. But do we need to buy all new clothes as Autumn begins?

What is second-hand September? Second hand September is a yearly campaign, designed to encourage people to consider their clothes shopping habits and the impact of fast fashion, and to explore other options – looking at ways to utilise pre-loved clothing, instead of always buying new.

Why is it important? Fashion is a significant contributor to pollution and the industry generates millions of tonnes of waste each year. Many items of clothing are worn only a handful of times before ending up in landfill and the environmental impact of this high demand for new clothes is considerable.

What can we do?

- * Buy clothing second hand: use thrift/charity shops, vintage stores or online marketplaces.
- * Host/attend clothing swaps with friends or family, exchanging items that are no longer worn.
- * Repair, alter or repurpose clothes to extend their life.
- * Donate unwanted clothing, rather than throwing it away.
