Dear friends and parishioners,

One thing I have never forgotten from my school French lessons was being told that in France the cornflower is the equivalent of the poppy which we wear for remembrance. I had not realised that the cornflower, like the poppy, had continued to grow in the devastated fields of France and Belgium during and after the First World War. The delicacy yet tenacity which both flowers share, symbolise both the fragile nature of life, and also the hope of something new, and something which could continue in the future.

I have used the reflective prayer below for a number of years; and in various services and with groups of all ages. I offer it to you this year, as you reflect on the poppies which many of us will wear in November:

Look at your poppy or that of someone sitting near you if you don't have one. Poppies are bright and cheerful flowers: give thanks to God for the lives of those who have died in war, remembering all the joy they brought to families and friends, and all the good things they did for their home and their country.

Then look at the red petals: red reminds us of danger and harm. Ask God to be close to those who are still facing danger each day, to give courage to the armed forces, and compassion to all who help others.

Place your whole hand over the poppy: poppies are also fragile and need to be handled gently. God cares for those who are hurting and those who are sad. Ask God to comfort all who are grieving the loss of someone they love.

Finally place a finger on the centre of the poppy: ask God to help you play your part in working for peace in the world.

May God bless us with love, and those we remember; and bless the world with peace, this month and always.



WHY ARE POPPIES USED FOR REMEMBRANCE?

From War-Torn Fields to a Lasting Symbol

The battlefield:

During World War I, the fields of Northern France and Flanders were repeatedly bombed and fought over, creating a desolate, wartorn landscape.

A resilient bloom:

Poppies, particularly the scarlet corn poppy, flourished in the disturbed earth of these battle-scarred fields, growing among the bodies of fallen soldiers.

"In Flanders Fields":

In 1915, Canadian doctor John McCrae, deeply affected by the loss of a friend, wrote his famous poem, which captured the vibrant red poppies blooming in contrast to the death and destruction.

A Symbol of Remembrance and Hope Spreading the message:

After the poem's publication, people were inspired to adopt the poppy as a symbol of remembrance and hope for peace.

The Poppy Appeal:

The Royal British Legion adopted the poppy for its Poppy Appeal in 1921, cementing its role as a vital symbol for remembering the sacrifices of the Armed Forces.

In Flanders fields, the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row, That mark our place; and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard amid the guns below.

We are the Dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,
Loved and were loved, and now we lie,
In Flanders fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe:
To you from failing hands we throw
The torch; be yours to hold it high.
If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders fields.
