Dear friends and parishioners,

Has anyone else noticed that the range of things which you now get inside an Advent calendar has seemed to have expanded quite a lot? At my last search I found calendars with perfume, alcohol, hair grips, dog biscuits, socks, cheese (I suppose those last two could conceivably go together?!), not to mention good old-fashioned chocolate (and I know that there are a number of us who remember back even before the days of chocolate Advent calendars).

So, as well as being a countdown to Christmas, these have become a gift in themselves, little tiny moments of luxury. This could make me feel annoyed, as Advent for churchgoers is all about a time of preparation for the big moment, the festival time of Christmas. It's about prayer, reflection and stillness so that we can be ready for an important moment; just as Lent is a time of preparation for Easter.

But I don't feel annoyed, rather more as though these tiny moments can say something about the season we are approaching. At Christmas we see the divine becoming visible in the earthly. Jesus shows us God as one of us, the greatest gift, because it is in him and through him that God, as a vulnerable tiny baby, chose to show us love.

So those tiny gifts in the Advent calendars – yes, even the socks and the cheese! – can remind us that the tiniest of things, a newborn baby for example, can contain in itself the greatest of all loves. My prayer for you this Christmas, however you are feeling and whatever is going on in your life, is that you might glimpse the overwhelming love of God for you in at least one tiny moment.

As the golden hues of autumn become the cooler tones of winter, it means there will be no work party for the Friends on the Common during the month of December; just the very best and warmest wishes to all over the coming Christmas and New Year period.

Work will be on East Common, where we will be trimming back the hedge on the southern boundary in order to maintain its line of growth, and reduce its height and re-weave and re-lay the hedge where necessary. This will ensure that the hedgerow will eventually form a continuous dense habitat for nesting birds and a corridor for other animals. We will also cut back bracken and scrub between the southern boundary hedge and the footpath, and lightly trim brambles on the west boundary – the conservation hedgerow. This will improve the hedgerow as a habitat for breeding birds, while preventing it from encroaching further onto the grassland.



### **DECEMBER LEGEND - ST LUCIA'S DAY**

In the Scandinavian, or Norse, countries of Sweden, Norway, and Finland, the winter months are very dark. On 13<sup>th</sup> December, in honour of St. Lucia, a grand Festival of Light is held. One of the earliest Christian martyrs, St. Lucia was killed by the Romans in 304AD because of her religious beliefs.

According to Swedish legend, after Lucia's death, a ship carrying a maiden "clothed in white and crowned with light" appeared on the shore in the Swedish province of Varmland during a great famine. The maiden, believed to be Lucia, distributed food and clothing to the needy, thus endearing herself to the Swedish people.

In Scandinavian countries each town elects its own St. Lucia. The festival begins with a procession led by the St. Lucia maiden, who is followed by young girls dressed in white and wearing lighted wreaths on their heads and boys dressed in white pyjama-like costume singing traditional songs. The festival marks the beginning of the Christmas season in Scandinavia, and it is meant to bring hope and light during the darkest time of the year.
